

HAVERHILL SAFER NEIGHBOURHOOD TEAM

Report to Poslingford Annual Parish Council Meeting – May 2018

This report covers the period from 01/04/2017 through to and inclusive of Sunday 01/05/2018. These statistics duplicate those available to all via the www.police.uk web site albeit on a 2 month delay.

In chronological order...

Burglary Non-Dwelling – Between 30/05/17 and 01/06/18 a Petrol Strimmer was stolen from an insecure and unalarmed shed in the area of The Street.

Public Order/Racial Incident – On 04/06/17 a delivery driver entered, in error, a private yard in the village and was subjected to a racial slur from a man who also made efforts to inhibit the complainant and his vehicle from leaving. Police attended and tried to placate all involved. The victim, who's not local, declined to substantiate the allegation but the investigation stands.

Theft from Motor Vehicle – Overnight 29/09/17 into 30/09/17 an expensive handbag and contents were stolen from a car in the village. The handbag and contents were later found discarded in a private field in Cavendish just off the A1092.

Theft from Motor Vehicle – Again, overnight into 30/09/17, a laptop was stolen from an unattended car left in the area of The Street.

Malicious Communications – On 29/09/17 and following being involved in a low level Road Traffic Collision elsewhere in the county, a local resident started to receive unwanted and unmerited communications from the other motorist involved. Police intervention was made which concluded the issue. This type of offence is recorded at the victims home address as it's often impossible to pinpoint from where the nuisance communications were sent from.

Malicious Communications – Between 01/11/17 and 14/11/17 an unknown suspect demanded monies owing to alleged past wrongdoings of a parishoners relative. No threats were made hence no Blackmail offence... and again police intervention brought this problem to a swift conclusion.

Theft – During the morning of 04/02/18, a quantity of milk and a metal container was stolen from outside a house on the Stansfield Road
