Accessibility Statement

Poslingford Parish Council is committed to making its website accessible in accordance with the Public Sector Bodies (Websites and Mobile Applications) (No. 2) Accessibility Regulations 2018.

Compliance status

This website is partially compliant with the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines version 2.2 AA standard, due to the non-compliance and exemptions listed below.

Non-accessible content

The content listed below is non-accessible for the following reason(s):

Most content is available only as Portable Document Format (PDF) files as opposed to Hyper Text Markup Language (HTML). These PDF files include minutes, agendas, policies and miscellaneous reports. Unlike HTML, the text size and spacing are sometimes not readily adjustable in PDF files. Similarly, PDF files are sometimes not compatible with screen reader software.

The parish of Poslingford has about 180 residents, a tax base in 2025-26 of about 92 properties and a planned precept of £4823. Whilst the Parish Council is committed to achieving full accessibility of its digital service, the council it is constrained as to the extent and speed to which this can be achieved.

Preparation of this accessibility statement

This statement was prepared on 7 January 2026.

The self-assessment of the website was done using the Web Accessibility Evaluation Tool (WAVE) which is a browser extension that detects and highlights possible areas of non-compliance.

The statement was last reviewed on 7 January 2026.
